Coverage Guidelines

The Plan will approve quantities over 30 tablets per 30 days and 84 tablets per year may be granted if the member meets the following criteria:

- The request is for a one-month continuation of treatment due to extensive toenail onychomycosis infection for a member who has received a 3-month course of therapy

Continuation of Therapy

Reauthorization will require documentation of a positive response to therapy.

Limitations

- Approvals will be granted for 1 tablet daily (#28 tablets) for 4 weeks only
